Day 1: Families

Father, Son and Holy Spirit, we lift up to You today our families. We thank You for them and pray for Your blessing and protection for them. Day 3: Children and elderly

Dearest Jesus, we call out to You today to bless our young and our old - two groups of us who must be finding our present circumstances especially hard to cope with and understand. Many are really struggling now and predictions are that up to 20% of businesses may not open again after a prolonged lockdown. Some are struggling because of falling short of any help that is currently on offer. Others are wondering how they will be able to keep workers on after furlough is finished and perhaps business will be limited with distancing restrictions. Our own island home is particularly vulnerable, being so dependent on tourism. Dear God, we pray that all who are struggling may turn to You in the confident hope of Your provision, strengthening and guidance. We ask this in Jesus' name, Amen.

Day 6: Government and those in leadership

King of Kings and Lords of Lords, we turn to You today and lift up before You our Government and all who are in positions of leadership and power. We pray first that we might be blessed with ones who know You - Your leading and guiding, but most of all we pray that they may be blessed with Your wisdom, because that is what we need right now.
